The last NCLS was during COVID-19, which makes it important to check across diverse contexts about what is actually happening in church life.

NCLS Regional Coordinators

Regional Coordinators are nominated by their denomination or region (synod, state etc.) to liaise with NCLS Research throughout the survey project.

In most cases this person oversees the organisation of the survey in their region and is the main point of contact for their churches.

A list of Regional Coordinators will be on the 2026 NCLS website for local churches to make contact with.

We will provide Coordinators with survey project information and promotional material for use with local churches.

Agencies

Other agencies may also commission questions to go to a randomly selected sample of church attenders across denominations and the nation.

Resources for local churches and leaders

Research-based insights

The 2026 NCLS will create a new dataset for use by researchers to analyse trends and patterns in church life.

How to maximise denominational benefits

When denominations sponsor churches, you will unlock extra reports with high level denominational results.

Minimum threshold:

To unlock high level reports you need a minimum number of churches in order to meet a reliable threshold.



How it works

1. Order surveys.

- Orders for surveys can be placed by local churches or denominational staff.
- Churches will need enough surveys to cover regular attenders.
- Available in either paper or online format.

2. NCLS Research distributes a Survey Kit

The Survey Kit will have instructions. Surveys will be paper forms or online.

3. All churches choose their 'Survey Month' - August to October 2026.


- Each church can choose their preferred 'Survey Month' from August to October 2026.
- The best approach is to choose one week in the month when most attenders will take 15 minutes to complete the survey either before or during a worship service.
- Ask attenders to complete the survey together at the same time.
- During the Survey Month, encourage other regular attenders to complete the survey.

The Approach: Three separate integrated surveys

The National Church Life Survey uses three types of surveys to build a comprehensive profile of the life of the whole church: the people, the leaders, the assets and activities and an evaluation of health and vitality.

Church Life Survey

Survey

For leaders to reflect on leadership development, personal wellbeing and their perspective on church health. 3

Local Church Audit

To map activities, resources and people in local churches

Sponsoring all three surveys will give you the most comprehensive profile of the life of the whole church.

Church Life Survey

Aim: For all attenders to reflect on their experience of local church life and vitality

Who does it

Adults: The Attender Survey gives each attender aged 15 years and over a voice to evaluate and reflect on their experience of church life.

Children: The Child Attender Survey is an optional survey that enables churches to hear the views of children aged 8 to 14 years.

Who gets results

- ✓ Denominations.
- √ Regions (Dioceses, Synods, States)
- √ Local churches.

How much?

\$400 per local church plus \$2 per survey form ordered (adult surveys in any language and child surveys)

Attenders reflect on qualities of church vitality:

- · attenders' evaluation of private devotions.
- · importance of God,
- growth in faith,
- nurturing worship,
- · belonging,
- evangelism,
- service, advocacy,
- leadership roles.
- · involvement of children and more.

Paper or online

Surveys for attenders will be available in paper and/or online formats. Each church will have their own online Survey Code. We intend to provide some paper surveys as a backup to all churches.

Translations

Surveys will be translated to key languages.

Previous examples include:

Anyone in ministry or pastoral leadership within a local church

- A. Senior leader (at minimum)
- B. Ministry/pastoral leaders who contribute significant time or who help set directions: staff & non-staff.



Example: Leaders may log in to access their personal dashboards which will show their own evaluation of personal wellbeing and resilience measures compared with wider benchmarks.












Outputs from the Local Church Audit

Ohurch Pulse Check



The goal: To estimate church attendance and faith commitments in 2026.
This work will extend earlier estimates.



A short Church Pulse Check will also be conducted with a sample of churches in 2027 and 2028.

National Impact Audit

The goal: To quantify the dollar value of the social contribution that local churches and attenders provide to the Australian community.

NB. We are currently developing a partnership with NAYBA, who will also collect information from agencies and non-Christian religious groups.

For denominational leaders

Denominational and regional leaders get access to a series of reports or dashboards. e.g Topics include:

- **Map of local churches:** Size, number of churches and type of churches (e.g. rural/urban, multicultural or monocultural)
- Attendance estimates: How many people go to church?
- **Organisation and leadership structures:** Number of staff? Worship services? Sunday schools? Youth groups? Discipleship groups? Governance and compliance?
- Interaction with community: How do local churches relate to their surrounding communities, to social issues and global needs? What do they offer in terms of social services and advocacy activities, educational activities, community partnerships and more?

Discounts & payment models



Discounts and subsidies

The 2026 NCLS may attract wider sponsorship, to help keep costs to a minimum for participating churches. There are also some options to manage your investment.

- \$300 flat rate for churches of less than 30 regular attenders.
- 2. Small churches clusters

 Small churches who partner in 'survey clusters' will attract a single admin fee and get a single cluster Profile of results.

 Surveys occur in each location. Suitable for clusters of small rural, cooperative, or house churches.
- High levels of local church participation (e.g. more than 80%) will attract an overall denominational discount.
- 4. Pay over multiple years
 You may make payments over more than one financial year.

Payment models

There are a number of models for how regions or denominations manage survey costs.

- 1. Full subsidy
 Denomination pays for all costs on behalf of their local churches.
- Denomination covers part of the costs (e.g. admin fee per church or for a selected group of churches).
- Denomination collects payment from local churches.

In general, NCLS Research invoices the NCLS Regional Co-ordinator as the key contact point.

Each region may choose to pass on some or all of the costs to the local church. Regions will be invited to pay a 30% deposit based on ballpark quotes during FY26.

Payments can be made over a number of financial years.
